It has been one of those magical weeks, where you hear children singing throughout the school as they practise for the harvest assembly next week. The stage is up and we are ready to receive your food donations from Monday. This week, Reception started their phonics sessions learning the sounds: 's', 'a', 't' and 'p'. They did a brilliant job learning our letter formation rhymes and a highlight was forming the letter 's' in cooked spaghetti! The class have also been outside a lot exploring their outside area. On Wednesday Mrs Emmett showed them how to make use of our crates and planks to make obstacle courses. Year 1 have been celebrating Harvest in English, Music and RE. They have been learning to use adjectives to describe the fruit in Handa's surprise, building more complex sentences. They are very excited to be performing the story for you in the Harvest Festival. In RE they wrote a wonderful acrostic poem. In maths they have been exploring how to compare numbers by describing 1 more and 1 less within 10. They are getting really good at using their STEM sentences. Year 2 have been finishing off their adventure letters and have made some fantastic illustrations to go alongside them just like the author Amy Husband. They have also started their new topic about stories with imaginary creatures and enjoyed reading the story Not Now Bernard and a Lion in the Meadow. In Maths they have been working on using number lines and identifying missing intervals as well as comparing different objects and numbers. In computing they have been learning more about coding and created their own algorithms to move Logo's turtle. In topic, KS1 have been learning how to use line to create shape, texture and pattern. They then applied their new skills by adding texture to the picture of a dinosaur. Year 2 sketched a dinosaur from a reference while Year 1 used stencils. Amazing art work! Have a great weekend!


